

Before applying to the Department of Developmental Disabilities, review the services that are and are not provided by DDD (Department of Developmental Disabilities). Services such as physical and occupational therapy, speech therapy and medication management are not available through DDD. Check with your health insurance coverage and your child's school district for assistance with these.

Some of the services available through the Department of Developmental Disabilities are Intensive In-Home services such as clinical and therapeutic services, applied behavior analysis and individual support services to assist with daily living skills. Family Support Services including respite services, assistive technology and educational advocacy for students are available as well. Summer camp and out of home treatment options are also available through DDD. See the complete description of services available [here](#).

If you are submitting your child's IEP, you may also want to ask the school district for the assessments they completed to make the IEP recommendations.

As part of the application process, a Child Adaptive Behavior Summary (CABS) will need to be completed. This needs to be completed by the child's primary caregiver. If someone other than the caregiver is completing the application, be prepared to have the CABS completed by the caregiver.
